### **Color Corps Report** (Stan Wasowski)


Stan reported that there are three honor guard opportunities coming up in January.

Bill thanked the Assembly and noted that he had a son in the Army Special Forces and prized this award greatly.



Pat took the floor and recounted how he had been the Commander of his local VFW post for some years. They had sent 5,000 units to the troops. He thanked the Assembly for their remembrance of widows, saying it was something that the VFW could improve. He also thanked the Assembly for their contribution to the Military Chaplains Fund. Pat was in the Air Force for 37 years and stated that people do not understand the amazing work that chaplains do. They are like monsignors over here. (large applause and standing ovation)

- We held our annual *Council Christmas Party* on December 3rd. About 120 members and spouses attended plus three clergy. Knight of the Year (Norb Braza) and Family of the Year (Sir Knight Bryan and wife Brandi Kler) were honored. Our Widow Mary Ann Deleria (widow of Sir Knight Bill Lehman) was honored for her food for the poor minis-tries.


