Faithful Navigator

The FN commented on the combined officer's installation ceremony for both the Assembly and St. Brigid and held at St. Brigid---- he thought the turnout was gratifying ad thanked host Grand Knight George Yourick for his participation in this experiment. He noted that the combined ceremony took no longer than either one ever took singly. He noted that the Master of the 4th Degree, Herb Broughton, was there and also thanked District Deputy Guy Stryker for his double duty as ceremonial officer.

He then acknowledged the Past Faithful Navigator, Dennis Klein, who had received a PFN plaque and then presented him with his PFN jewel ribbon for his tuxedo. Applause followed.

He then mentioned that an Honor Guard was requested at St. Brigid to celebrate the mass celebrating the raising of Father Joe Corbett to Monsignor, who is now the Vicar General of the Archdiocese.

He then mentioned that Sunday August 12th has been declared Knights of Columbus Day by Governor Sonny Perdue. He noted that this speaks volumes for the organization and its growing impact in our area.

He also mentioned that Cardinal Bertoni, the Vatican Secretary of State, is traveling to the Annual KofC Supreme Convention in Nashville. He is the second highest ranking Vatican official after the pope (i.e the vice-pope.) The meeting was broadcast for the first time live over the Catholic EWTN network in the US and also in Canada.

He also recognized Urban Rump for his work with the Veterans. He will be formally recognized as our Chairperson of the Veteran's Hospital Administration Committee and Dennis Klein has submitted paperwork for formal recognition on these projects. Master Herb Broughton has announced a forthcoming award for Urban. Applause followed.

He announced that our first Assembly officer's meeting would be held shortly at All Saints McGivney Hall. He also asked the cooperation of all in getting cooperation from the council in getting new 4th degree members.

The FN then read a formal communication regarding the formation of the new Assembly that will be in District 16. Formation meetings are being held and transfer forms are being sought to staff the new assembly. It does not seem that those efforts are seeing a lot of traction at this time.

Faithful Purser Report

Sir Knight Rich Nielson reported that he had received no bills – meaning that the assembly meal was on All Saints—this elicited a quick search by Benny Mastrogiovanni who produced one. The starting monthly balance was \$4,026, the bills totaled \$180, awards were \$85, bringing it to \$3,761 with a credit from Supreme for \$15 yielding a grand total of \$3,776. Then \$193 more from 50-50 money and 5 member dues raised the final total to \$3,969.

Sir Knight Heald noted that there are now 176 members with 12 unpaid and the October 13th exemplification should bring us more members.
