Faithful Navigator Report

Faithful Navigator thanked Chuck Langgood for procuring the Matthew Kelly Video series and playing it during the social hour. He also noted that Kelly's book "Rediscovering Catholicism" was available to those who wanted it at no charge.

FN apologized for missing previous meetings.

He went on to observe that he thought that Candidate Mitt Romney's decision to end his candidacy that morning in a show of unity was a patriotic act that was deserving of our admiration. Grand Knight Greg Crnkovich reminded him that as knights we should refrain from any hint of political favoritism and FN stated that Greg raised a fair point.

Faithful Purser

Rich Neilson reported a January 1 opening balance of \$1,227. January debits were \$876 and income from dues was 2,493, yielding Feb 1 balance of \$2,844. With more net dues income during the meeting, he reported a final balance of \$3,161.

Faithful Comptroller

SK Bob Heald noted that we had 172 members (same as last month). He has mailed membership cards to those who paid dues. Still 42 not paid. Guy Stryker and Bill O'Shaughnessy will call those members. It is expected 10-15 of those will choose not to stay with this Assembly.

Faithful Captain called upon Al Garofalo to speak about a fund raising raffle now being used successfully at a new Assembly in Florida now headed by our former member, George Novak. It involves an annual raffle fund that grows with yearly purchase of a maximum of 200 tickets at \$20 each yielding \$4,000 and pays \$100 to the winner at each monthly meeting. The winner's name always goes back into the pot. He explained that the excess in the fund could be used for charitable purposes. He made a motion to investigate this concept. It was tabled until the New Business section of the meeting.



Committee Reports

Commander Report

Commander Joe Noa confirmed that the Honor Guards managed by Ernie Spencer had been reported to him in accordance with the spirit of the procedures established. Noa announced that Honor Guards were held for two 50th Wedding Anniversary celebrations in February for two Assembly members from All Saints, Jim Rainsford and Bob Morell. He also noted the Assembly had teamed with another Assembly for a pro-life Mass at St. Peter Chanel.

The next event will be at St. Andrew on Feb. 21st for a Confirmation. On March 7th, Archbishop Gregory will celebrate First Friday Mass at St. Andrew. A St. Patrick's Mass at the Cathedral on March 17 will also require a Guard. Another event with St. Brigid and St. Peter Chanel for Pro-life will be requested. Noa asked that members help other councils and not just their own.

Patriotic Committee

Urban Rump reported that he continues collecting dollars in his bucket for the wounded warriors and will hold it until he gets a meaningful amount to send. He collected \$22 last meeting.

He also reported that he has met with the USO and they have a date of April 29th to greet returning veterans at the Atlanta Airport and then host them during the day at the Center.

He made another delivery of donated items to the Veteran's Hospital. Applause followed.

A Patriotism Raffle Committee was set up with Dennis Caniglia, Urban Rump, and Al Garofalo serving.

Sir Knight Chris Scoma of St. Andrew requested support of the Girl Scout effort to send cookies to the troops. A bucket was passed for contributions.

Entertainment Committee

Sean O'Neill announced that a \$500 check was delivered to the DoubleTree Hotel. A contract has not yet been completed, but is being worked out. A speaker and music man are being searched. The cost is only \$35/per person this year and there will again be three meal choices. Cutoff date is end of February for half the amount due. No walkups are allowed. Bob Heald would prefer one check for each table for convenience. He stressed that an email stating that a table was committed even before the money was sent. Some checks were collected at the meeting.

This year's cost (\$35/person) would be less than last year when we had 44 attendees. A motion was made and passed that a deposit of \$500 would be sent to the DoubleTree Inn. The event will be open to all knights, not only fourth degree members. In fact, the event is open to all people who want to come. Every officer of the Assembly should try to get enough people to attend with him to fill a table of eight. Dress is formal with tuxedo and social baldric required for Assembly members. Non-fourth degree Knights would wear ordinary suits. A letter urging participation will go out to all Grand Knights. Pastors of all Assembly Councils will be invited without charge. Checks go to Bob Heald by Feb. 28th.

Sir Knight Bob Heald has cautioned that proper applications must be submitted to the Sheriff of DeKalb County and a written waiver must be received by us. The sheriff must understand what he is signing, since we are an insurance company and not a 501(C3).



Discussion then followed whether or not the tickets could be sold outside DeKalb County. The consensus of unknown voices was that they could be sold anywhere as long as the raffle was held in DeKalb County.

The motion was called and the vote was passed with one nay vote.
