The previous meeting minutes were transmitted electronically and no corrections were needed – member approved.

Faithful Navigator Report:

- The Faithful Navigator (FN) complimented Tony Santoro on his fine transcribing of the minutes again this month.
- Thanks were given to the chefs of St. Andrew that prepared the evening chili meal that was very tasty and abundant.
- FN announced that the focus of the meeting would be on the planning and execution of the upcoming February 12 Valentine's Day Social at Altobeli' Italian Restaurant. Last minute reservations are being received and the dinner total has passed 50 committed attendees. The cost is pegged at \$60 per couple including tax and gratuity. FN advised that this was a wonderful bargain in these inflationary times. A good time will be had by all with a piano bar singer performing this time. Bill Zaryski is taking checks and reservations tonight still.
- FN then thanked Faithful Admiral, Bill Lewis, for providing him with a manual that contains all the instructions for Assembly ceremonies such as Blessing of the Swords, Renewal of Vows, Assembly Meetings Funerals for Sir Knights, and some others. FN had never seen all this information in one binder together. A manual on how to display the American Flag properly for any contingency and how to fold it and retire it was included. FN quipped that apparently the Faithful Admiral thought the FN needed more printed instructions (laughter).
- FN announced that our new Faithful Friar, Monsignor Donald Kiernan, could not attend tonight, but sends his love and will attend as many meetings as he is able. He requires a ride from St. George Village in Roswell because he is wheelchair-bound. We hope that we can provide transportation to him in both directions.

Faithful Comptroller: Bill Zaryski

FC announced that we have a very good commitment from 52 people for the upcoming Altobeli Social. This is exactly how many we had last time. We should get a few more this time. All bu 6 of the 52 have already paid. So three couples will pay at the door.

We will have a larger room this time that will hold up to 65 attendees. Bob Webster is making the arrangements with Altobeli's.

On the subject of dues payment, exactly one-third of the members have not yet paid. Today's mail did yield four more payments. He has all the membership cards for those who have paid.

He moved to the subject of the budget and the item line for donations. In one donation last meeting, we wiped out our budget of \$600. In order to add more flexibility to the budget, a revised budget will be submitted to the membership before the next meeting to allow further charitable donations this year.

He proposed raising the donation item line from \$600 to \$2,000 by making three minor changes. We believe we can drop the regalia allowance from \$2,000 to 1,000, the chalice budget from \$2,000 to \$1,000, and the 4th degree exemplification hospitality suite allowance from \$500 to \$100. This would free the additional \$1,400 that would allow our charitable donations to rise from \$600 to \$2,000. A motion was raised to amend the budget in this fashion.

During discussion of the motion, Fernando Paguaro asked why we do not have fundraisers like the Councils. He was advised that Assembly fundraisers are allowed, but we have to be careful not to conflict with Council fundraisers. Assemblies usually exist on their dues, except in special cases.

A question was raised as to why we didn't simply take 1,600 out of our cash on hand rather than moving items around. Zaryski stated that we always try to run a year on a net zero basis just as good financial practice. We started the year with \$8,000 in the ban and we would like to end the year with \$8,000, since some slack has been identified.

Next year we could intentionally budget a shortfall to begin draining down our cash reserves if we wish. Thus far we are on a balanced course, but the food donations for tonight's meal we \$85 and meal cost \$222. These are the types of unforeseen expenditures that cause deficit consequences. We have a very large April 27th social with unknown



expenditures. It is very nice to have a cushion in the bank. Our Assembly has had some very low balances in past years causing us to be conservative.

A question was raised about how many active dues-paying members do we have? Of the 227 members, we have four or five honorary life members who pay no dues, all clergy members pay no dues, and members in dire circumstances pay no dues. About 200 members pay dues of \$30 per year giving us about \$6,000 income from dues every year.

Before voting on the resolution to revise the budget, it was suggested that we should email out the revised budget and vote on it during the March meeting. It was agreed to do this.

Patriotism: John Bird

Jon brought to our attention that the Georgia National Guard at Dobbins Air Base was looking for volunteers to provide transportation, spiritual counseling, home grounds maintenance, finances, utilities assistance, job fairs, wellness checks, etc. He has a document that requests these services that he can share. It will be mailed to all members.

He also will let us know about the donation request he raises every year for the Atlanta Vietnam Veterans Association that raises money for a memorial erected in honor of a fallen local Georgia soldier. This year's honoree is a Marist grad. A memorial will be erected the Thursday before Memorial Day at Marist. Jon will request a donation next month. There will be a nice ceremony with a parade and a flyover. We will give out more info as it is received. Our people should attend.

Social Committee: Chuck Langood

The committee mas met to make some primary arrangements. The date is Saturday, April 27th, at St. Andrew Parish Center. The ticket price will be around \$35 per person. There will, of course, be no tax gratuity. The Assembly is hoping that the councils will sponsor any honorees that come from their councils, since they will not pay for dinner. We expect that priests will not pay as well.

World War II veteran honorees can be from any group. They need not be Knights of even Catholics. They will be honored for their service. Attendees for the dinner can be from the councils or the public as well. We would like about 175 to 200 attendees. We will have pulpit announcements to find veterans. Sir Knight Klein mentioned that this would be a good recruitment opportunity with the publicity received.

A question as whether we could include Korean War vets. It was decided that there are too many living Korean vets, since they are 12 years younger.

Chalice committee:


We have purchased another chalice. We will put the next three names on that chalice and hold off until the next fraternal year (July 1) to purchase the next chalice.
