Because the Assembly's new Faithful Friar, Monsignor David Talley, was out of town that night, Father Michael Kingery, a 4th Degree Brother from

Saint Andrew, officiated along with the District Master, Tom Gissy, and performed the Blessing of the Sword Ceremony in the St. Brigid Sanctuary. This ceremony seems to have originated in Canada and has seldom been seen before in the U.S.A.

After dinner, the general meeting started at 8:05 PM and lasted only 17 minutes until 8:21 PM. The Faithful Scribe, Lou Hlad, was out of town and the voice recorder duties were handled by others. Only a Faithful Navigator's Report and a Report by the Color Corps Commander were on the agenda.

Faithful Navigator's Report

Dick Kobylski reminded the brothers about the need to "serve those who served" by volunteering to greet returning troops at the airport and serving the ongoing need of the veterans in the VA Hospital.

He had previously sent out a document (enclosed) that outlines some of the duties that were outlined by membership suggestions. It lists some of the brothers who have agreed to fill those needs. Looking in on veterans, giving them rides as required, bringing them reading material and toiletries, etc. are some of the ministries for which he is asking support. He would like more suggestions at the August meeting at All Saints.

Before introducing the Commander, he mentioned how proud he was of the 70 honor guard ceremonies completed in the last fraternal year. He opined that the beauty of the ceremonies has been spurring other third degree members to ask how they could gain entry to these Color Corps events. He would like to see an outstanding number of brothers as candidates for the next 4th degree exemplification on November 12th at St. John Neumann Church in Lilburn.

Commander's Report

Bob Mitchell began his report by asking those whose names he called to stand. These were apparently the members who had participated in ten or more honor guard activities. He called off the names of those participating in the lower levels and asked them to sit. Those remaining standing were members with twenty of more events.
