Report of Committees

Ad Hoc Widows Committee (Lou Hlad)

All Saints has the great bulk of widows because of their 53 deceased knights. About 40 widows of these men still live in the local area. A detailed spreadsheet of their addresses and email addresses (if they have one) was created by All Saints. We furnish them with newsletters to keep them involved. We intent to invite them to our October Memorial Mass on Wednesday October 14th at All Saints.

We need contact information for their deceased Assembly members from our two other councils.as well. Jim Knapp will be the widow contact for Mary Our Queen and Mike Bagnulo will furnish the St. Andrew widow contacts.

Hlad requested a contact for St. Brigid widows of our former St. Brigid deceased. Bob Webster of St. Brigid stated that the St. Brigid folks now honors their dead in a separate Memorial Ceremony and we no longer have to include theirs.

Social Committee (Chuck Langgood and Doc Malone)

Chuck Langgood called for a show of hands of all who were planning to attend the Saturday June 13th Vietnam Vets Appreciation Dinner at All Saints. Many hands appeared. He reminded all that we need guests in the seats to honor the 40 vets honored and to pay for the complementary dinners for same. He encouraged them to bring their wives as well.

He announced that the Johns Creek Veterans Association will not be available to perform the color corps ceremony like last year. We must rely on our Honor Guard.

Setup, dinnerware, decorations must be arranged. Name cards, table assignments, signs must be completed. Langgood and Doc Malone are working on the printed programs. Everyone is invited to the 5 PM Mass at All Saints before the dinner.

Monsignor Marren will say the Mass. Vets will sit in a specific area. That Mass has been assigned to another family with special significance. We are forced to move a Mass said for the vets to Sunday July 5th. Honorees will be moved to McGivney Hall for staging before being escorted to the Gym.

The O'Callahan Assembly will allow us to borrow their huge American flag to decorate our stage area. We can also use their table decorations from last year. An official eVite will go out and a slideshow is being prepared.

The honorees will be limited to only <u>Knights</u> who served in any military capacity during the Vietnam era, their spouses, and priests. An attempt would be made to keep the tickets at about \$30 per person. Bar drinks are extra. Get your tuxedos cleaned..

Patriotic Report (Jon Bird, Bob Santos)

Jon Bird was in the governor's office for a presentation to the Atlanta Vietnam Veterans Business Association for a very nice event. Next Monday the Mayor of Atlanta is stepping up to the plate by inviting Vietnam Era members to his office for recognition.

He mentioned the Moving Wall in Rockdale park that has a series of events in May. Even closer to home, the Marietta National Cemetery will honor the 40th anniversary of the end of the Vietnam War.

Santos mentioned that the Georgia State Council has some exciting Military Hero Program patriotic events on tap. A military chaplain scholarship, Wheelchairs for Veterans, Frontline Faith MP3 players, Military Order of the Purple heart, Wreaths Across America, and a gala dinner with patriotic speeches encouraging men toward the priesthood and military chaplainship. The number of military chaplains has decreased from 400 to 232 today. Only 8% are Catholic. Santos will be visiting councils to see if any of their RSVP seminarian candidates would consider becoming military chaplains.

Unfinished Business (Dick Marklein)

Sir Knight Dick Marklein of All Saints announced that he is embarking on May 31st on

a coast to coast bike ride to raise money for the new Jesuit High School, *Cristo Rey-Atlanta*, in mid-town. His goal is \$30,000.



His cycling adventure begins May 31st in San Francisco and ends July 21st in Portsmouth, New Hampshire. He will personally be funding all the expenses associated with the trip. All monies raised will benefit Christo Rey science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) programs.

Other riders will accompany him, but he is the only one riding for Christo Rey. Donations are tax deductible and are already streaming in. All Saints Council donated \$500 with another \$500 to follow.


Split-the-Pot Award
