Charity Committee—Nick Mattera/ Dave Mason

FN had a conference call with them. Dave Mason has volunteered to be the chairman of the committee and speak for them.

Dave Mason rose to introduce himself as chairman. He said it was fortuitous that the Assembly had some money. He recalled that the Golf Tournament at Bear's Best in Suwanee last year had put us in a good financial position. Of the \$16,000 profit, about \$10,500 has been given to patriotic causes thus far. We just donated \$250 to the Peachtree Corners Memorial Garden. That leaves \$5,104 to disperse.

Dave talked about the Faustina Rosary Guild that makes rosaries for vets out of their own pocket. He suggested \$250 for supplies. Dennis Klein suggested we double it to \$500. The amount was adjusted to \$500 and voted as such.

Dave moved to the Chaplains Fund. He recommended \$3,000 for the Chaplains Fund last month. Because it was a large amount. It was approved this month.

Jon Bird had a request last month for Atlanta Vietnam Veterans Business Assoc (AVVBA) for a \$500 scholarship. It was approved this month.

Tom Burleigh of All Saints volunteers his time and expense to Lourdes, France to help the veterans who seek the healing waters. An expense of \$1,000 was recommended last month. It was approved this month.

The total expenditures approved above was \$5,000.. That leaves \$104 left from the Golf Tournament funds. Jon Bird suggested that it be added to his fund, he would match it. This additional \$104 amount would have to be voted on next month.

Fund Raising Committee—Nick Mattera/Bob Santos

Bob Santos was not present, so the wheel chair issue awaits his return.

Santos brought up last meeting the possibility of funding a wheel chair or several for the veterans, because that is a knight Georgia State Program. Len Dorrien brought up that the VA has an abundance of wheelchairs already not given out. It was decided to see if wheelchairs were needed outside government programs.

FN cautioned that we need to be careful in fundraising as to not step on council toes.

Faithful Scribe Report—Lou Hlad

Other than some thanks from a couple of widows, we have not received any Assembly communications.

As I do every month, I sent out the Assembly minutes and also the registration instructions for web site membership.

I should advise that our Commander, Bob Mitchell, will be away on an extended trip to Australia on April 3rd and will not be back until May 14th. Steve Strong will take on his duties.

We received thanks from 2 widows that received our council newsletter and two others that played Bingo this month. Our widows also eat free at our fish fry events. Old Business—Deacon Ken Melvin

He stated that immigration is out of control and the government is doing all it can to deal with it. He serves at Corpus Christi Parish in Stone Mountain. He deals with immigrant who have health issues and are trying to get a deferment to stay in the country. He is working with Catholic Charities and St. Vincent de Paul to allow them to stay because travel could mean instant death.

He asked if anyone knew of any agencies or avenues that could help him help sick immigrants from being deported.

FN mentioned that Bob Santos will be at the next meeting to address the veterans wheelchair program misunderstanding.

New Business — Nick Mattera

With the move of Stan Wasowski to Florida, we will need a new Faithful admiral. That position is third in position to the FN and Faithful Captain. It is generally a position that deals with membership retention, and prayer leadership at meetings.

(Stan is doing well in Florida. In fact he was just in town to attend to a legal matter and stayed overnight with Lou Hlad and worked at one of our fish frys to the surprise of all. He is looking for a new Council and Assembly in Florida.)

Sir Knight Al Alberghini's Close Call

Good Samaritans

To the Editor:

After a particularly frightening event, we spent a long week at Emory St. Joseph Hospital. We're now home and have many people we would like to thank and acknowledge for that.

A week ago while dining with friends at Carbonara Trattoria, my husband, Al, suffered two incidences of syncope, which presented like a major diabetic event and he passed out twice. Owner Rafik Cressaty and his staff never missed a beat, with the bartender immediately supplying us with orange juice – the usual quick low-sugar solution.

Fortunately for us, there were medical personnel dining there as well who immediately came to our assistance. "Dr. Steve" was the first to get to us and jumped right in to stabilize the situation, leaving his own table to remain with us throughout. A nurse also left her party to assist us. We apologize for not remembering

her name in the excitement, and hope she sees this letter and knows how grateful we are to her.

After efforts to get Al back on his feet failed, these angels called 911. DeKalb Fire Department arrived first and began emergency efforts. Shortly afterwards, DeKalb EMT's arrived and transferred him to the hospital.

The staff at Emory St. Joseph ER, efficiently and professionally assessed the situation and administered the proper cardiac treatment measures. It was decided that Dr. Anshul Patel would replace Al's pacemaker with one that also contains a defibrillator. He's now getting his legs under him again and has experienced only mild discomfort.

We are proud and grateful that we have the best services and people living and working in Dunwoody on behalf of all of us. While we hope never to face another such incident, we know that we will be in the best of hands.





Monsignor Kiernan, 93, Has Passed

KIERNAN, Msgr. R. Donald Georgian at heart with a Boston accent Msgr. R. Donald Kiernan, beloved and longtime priest of the Archdiocese of Atlanta, died Tuesday, Jan. 9. He was 93. He was born in Taunton, Massachusetts, on Dec. 28, 1924, the son of Thomas F. and Lena V. (Doherty) Kiernan. In March 1945, he entered Mount St. Mary's Seminary in Emmitsburg, Maryland. He was ordained to the priesthood on May 4 1949, by Cardinal Richard Cushing, of Boston. Driving to Georgia for his first assignment, he pulled into a roadside cornfield to dress before reporting for duty as assistant rector of the Cathedral of John the Baptist in Savannah. At the time, the Diocese of Savannah included the entire state of Georgia. Msgr. Kiernan served the new Atlanta Diocese from the time it was established in 1956. His pastorates from 1956 to 1985 included St. Peter Church, LaGrange; St. Bernadette Church, Cedartown; St. Michael Church, Gainesville; St. Anthony of Padua Church, Atlanta; St. Jude Church, Sandy Springs; and Immaculate Heart of Mary Church, Atlanta. He brought his signature song "Butter Beans" and founded the annual Hoe Down as pastor of All Saints Church in Dunwoody beginning in 1985, retiring in 2011. Named a monsignor in 1969, Msgr. Kiernan als served in a variety of roles for the archdiocese, includin education, the Metropolitan Tribunal, priest personnel and as vicar general from 2000-2005. He was especially active as an ambassador to community and statewide organizations as metro Atlanta grew. He was a colleague to Georgia governors and Atlanta mayors over the decades, in addition to chiefs of police and public servants. He combined his lifelong love of people and law enforcement founding the Georgia Association of Chiefs of Police and serving as its director and chaplain for over 20 years. He was also a chaplain to the DeKalb County police, Metropolitan Atlanta police, Georgia State Patrol, Federal Bureau of Investigation and local division

of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms. Bringing his style and sense of humor to the table, Msgr. Kiernan served as an editor of The Georgia Bulletin for 13 years, beginning in 1966. He was a chaplain for the Knights of Columbus and active in Boy Scouts in metro Atlanta. He received several honorary doctorates, including from Providence College, his alma mater, and Georgia State University. His joy in the company of others continued into retirement. He "held court" at his weekly Monday dinner club, enjoyed evenings out at Alpine, and attended 5pm vigil Mass at All Saints. He faithfully heard confessions as OLPH for more than a quarter century until the very end. A vigil and rosary for Msgr. Kiernan will be held at 6 p.m. on Tuesday, Jan. 16, at All Saints Church, 2443 Mt. Vernon Road, Dunwoody. A funeral Mass will be celebrated on Wednesday, Jan. 17, at 11 a.m. at All Saints. The celebrant will be Bishop Bernard E. Shlesinger III. A reception will follow. Interment will follow at a later time at the parish's columbarium. In lieu of flowers, donations in Msgr. He is survived by the children and grandchildren of his four siblings and the countless friends with whom he shared a red wine and Diet Coke.
