Note: Bob Webster drops off as Trustee-one year term and is no longer an officer. Rich Tomaszewski has chosen to not rerun as Comptroller. Dave Lemcoe moves from Purser to Comptroller. The Purser position is currently open. Euse Durah is a new officer as Outer Sentinel. Wulf Lindenau moves into the Trustee rotation as Three Year Term.

Faithful Navigator Report— Nick Mattera

FN thanked the honor guard for their wonderful showing at the 50th Anniversary of Monsignor James Fennessy's ordination.

He mentioned that this was the start of our final year wearing the old regalia to the sound of displeasure. He mentioned that three brothers were dropped from our ranks because they moved or were not reachable.

He displayed a fine photo of the latest chalice with engraved names to the two widows that were no able to attend the chalice presentation with the decedent names. Sir Knight Carl Stryker sent back a nice note in remembrance of his father, Guy Stryker.

FN noted that he is asking the Mitchells to update the web site with more features to lure more traffic to it.

There are still 16 brothers who have not paid their dues.

Faithful Comptroller Report—Rich Tomaszewski

- **Checking Account Balance**: As of May 31, 2018, the balance is \$13,985.70. All of the \$5,354.29 earmarked for Patriotic Events Funds from the Golf Tournament has been allocated and distributed to the appropriate charities.
- Membership: Currently, we have 193 members in our Assembly.
- **Membership Dues 2018**: Progress continues to be made. Currently, over 91% of the Assembly has paid its dues. There is still time to pay for those individuals that have not paid.
- **Upcoming Projects:** 2018-2019 Budget, the Annual Audit and Filing of the Assembly Taxes.
- Bob Mitchell noted that more money was allocated for chalices. He asked for an accounting of how many chalices were needed versus how many decedents were not honored yet.
- It was noted that we have eight unhonored brothers. Two are priests that get a solitary chalice. The chalices will have a 3-1-3-1 name distribution.
- It was reiterated that Father Dan McCormick was only a first degree knight and would not normally be eligible for a chalice. Further research done on his records shows only a first degree in council records and no mention of him in our Assembly roster.
- Tomaszewski noted that the number of members in the Assembly has declined due to death and moving. Since this is the major source of our revenue, either we must recruit better of raise our dues.
- A vote was called to approve the budget for next year and it was approved. (see page 14)

Faithful Scribe Report—Lou Hlad

Ad Hoc Widows Committee—Lou Hlad

- Updated our Widow Database for all our recent Assembly and Council deaths in preparation for our October Mass of Remembrance.
- Sent out council newsletter to our widows and always get a couple of nice thank-yous every month.

Two widows played Bingo gratis in May.

Fund Raising Committee—Nick Mattera

FN has been investigating various ideas for fund raising. He has discovered that Casino Night is illegal. He mentioned a possibility of a flea market event. It would be simple to pull off with only tables to be set up and torn down. Should be able to raise two or three thousand dollars profit. He will investigate. Money prizes are illegal, but Money purchases are not.

There was a discussion about whether a casino night that awarded tickets or prizes rather than cash are indeed legal and have been done.

Church permission would be needed and that could be a problem.

Chalice Committee Report - (Ed Pierson)

Ed corrected a previous error in the minutes stating that we had given a travel chalice to Fr. John Klein. It was a standard chalice and that error is corrected below.

Ed has finally gotten hold of Fr. Bradley Starr after many attempts (applause). Father is very busy at St. Patrick Parish. He was interested in a travel chalice, but those will be discontinued. Because he had met our deceased Fr. Joseph Peek, it would be appropriate for Fr. Starr to be awarded a Fr. Peek chalice. A date for this presentation Mass is under negotiation.

Ed learned that Deacons Metz, Knight, and Bremer are about to become priests in June. Not all of them need chalices. Mike Bremer is slated as possibly needing a chalice. Ed is setting up a lunch date with him. Ed is looking for another possible recipient as well. Three chalices are allocated for next

fraternal year. The cost for these chalices will extend into the next budget cycle. Ed believes a regular chalice costs about \$471.

The English Company no longer sells travel chalices. The price from other sources is now around \$600. We need to limit these to only Missionaries or those that greatly need one.

Social Committee— Nick Mattera

FN reminded us about the social outing planned to an Atlanta Stripers (formerly Gwinnett Braves) minor league baseball game. They play in Lawrenceville. The Elizabeth Ann Seaton Assembly is going to a game there in June. August 18th has been chosen for a group of us to visit their Home Plate Club just behind home plate. - FN would like to organize a Military Chaplain Fund Drive this year. Each council must approach their pastor to ask permission for fund raising at the church doors. FN will do the pulpit announcements.

- Church construction is going very well and could be completed by year end depending upon weather and other circumstances.

- Donated \$500 to their lifeTeen Group for their mission trip to South Carolina.
- Sponsored a seminarian luncheon with Mass and 20 seminarians. He was impressed by the quality of the new men.
- Holding a second degree at St. Anne on June 18th.

All Saints—Lou Hlad

- All Saints lost no brothers to death this month, after losing three each of the last two months.
- Our monthly Bingo was resumed after cancelation due to Fr. McCormick's visitation. We had 132 players with a profit of about \$1,000 on May 24th.
- Council helped our Boy Scout troop with their pancake breakfast. .
- We held a Tootsie Roll Drive for Intellectual disabilities at the doors of several local businesses.
- We completed another successful Vidalia Onion Sale shipping in well over 2,000 ten-pound bags of onions which were distributed to 10 councils. All Saints sold its 500 bags at the doors of the church.
- We held a 1st degree on May 29th to add 5 new brothers for All Saints. One additional brother going to MOQ and one for the Basilica of the Sacred Heart Council were also added. Three of the five new All Saints additions are parishioners of St. Joseph Maronite Rite Catholic Church in Sandy Springs. That brings their numbers in our council to 16 brothers which will be the nucleus of a council to be spun off very soon.

Sir Knight Bob Fiscella's son, Jack, received \$1,000 (not from our council) and will attend University of Tennessee. Sir Knight Dennis Caniglia is President Emeritus of that organization.
- Council is planning for an appearance in the Dunwoody 4th of July Parade. Every year about 30,000 people view the parade.
- Our Knight acolyte teams participated in all funerals this month.
- We sent out a 20 page newsletter to all brothers, widows, and select outsiders this month.
