### **Chalice Committee Report - (Ed Pierson)**

Mark White, a deacon who will be ordained a priest on 6/1/2019 has been added as a later target recipient in his stead.

He could use a chalice to be permanently stationed at the prison he serves for himself and other priests to use it. We agreed to present him with his brother's chalice for this use.

# **Fundraising Committee—Bob Santos**

Bob stated that he had received a fundraising kit with suggestions for programs that could be implemented. He stated that all the projects mentioned were high profit programs yielding half of profits to the host group. He focused on two program suggestions.

One suggestion was the sale of scented religious candles for \$14 each that has a 50% profit margin. There are 8 different scents and each candle has Scripture printed on it. Mary Our Queen did it around Lent and made \$900.

Bob focused on a suggested program that raises money be selling squares on a scratch-off card. These are similar to lottery scratch-off cards except each card has 50 scratch spots. The buyers scratch off a square to see if they have donated an amount between 50 cents and three dollars. They then donate that amount on the spot. They then receive a pre-printed coupon sheet for deals from local venders to use as they wish. Each scratch card comes with 50 gift coupon sheets with savings from local vendors.

Each card has 50 scratch-off spots and generates 100 dollars when all spots are sold. The cost of obtaining a card is \$20 each for printing cost. The cards are customized for your organization.

If you order 10 scratch off cards, the assembly gets two extra scratch cards free (potential of \$200 more profit for the Assembly, if all 12 are completely scratched off.) Each \$20 card can generate \$100 if all squares are scratched. So a \$200 assembly investment for ten cards can return a total of \$1200 from 12 sold out cards.

Saturday January 26th is also reserved for a game at the Atlanta Gladiators at the Gwinnett Infinite Energy Area. For \$27 you can get an ice level ticket and a meal included and free parking. Orlando is the opponent. It is Star Wars Night and some people will be dressed up.

Bob is a preferred buyer for Gwinnett Striper baseball games. He has selected Saturday May 11th, 2019 at 6 PM for another group game at CoolRay field in Lawrenceville behind the visitor's dugout. The opponent will be the Pawtucket Red Sox, a farm team of Boston. Same Section 7 as before and food at the Home Plate Club for \$40/person as before.

Wulf bragged about how much fun we had at the last game.

Mattera mention a local play with some of our brothers in it called "No Body to Murder" on Nov. 2/3/4 at the Roswell Adult Recreation Center. Tickets at \$20/person. Flyers were handed out.

Bob also passed the hat to collect money for the State Hurricane Relief Fund to be sent to the State Council. Collected was \$94.

### Patriotic Report—Jon Bird

Jon had no report, but be reminded about a patriotic event announced by Bob Santos.

Peachtree Corners is building a new Veterans Memorial. The Peachtree Corners Veterans Monument Association made arrangements with a company to create a video of recording from veterans to be incorporated into the monuments as an interactive feature of the monuments. Ground will be broken on the project next month. The director wants the Assembly to be present at the event in the Spring. We will be featured on the video that plays at the monuments. The date is not yet known.


