Patriotic Report—Jon Bird

Jon relayed the history of the <u>Stars and Stripes Newspaper</u>. A newspaper in Bloomfield, Missouri was taken over by the military and given this name. There is a museum and veterans cemetery there honoring newspaper history. It struggles for donations like all small museums. Jon worked for this newspaper for three years in Tokyo. Jon suggested that we could donate to that museum as part of our veteran commitment. It is a 501 ©(3) charity. A discussion was undertaken and we voted to donate \$250 to the <u>Stars and Stripes Museum.</u>

Jon also noted that the Habitat folks have a "Repair with Kindness" program that finds teams to renovate homes for older people and especially veterans. He will find out more about it and maybe we can fix up someone's home as a group and invite other Assemblies as well. Small carpentry, access improvements, hanging doors, odd jobs, etc. would be anticipated.

While on the patriotic subject, Bob Santos reminded us that the Peachtree Corners Park project is scheduled for Saturday May 18th with honor guard. Bob has gotten some photos of Fr. Charles Watters for a video being prepared for the occasion. We have purchased a memorial Watters brick for the event. The event will also be on YouTube.

Trustee Report— Chuck Langgood

The trustees will meet very soon to discuss the elections upcoming in May.

Social Committee—Bob Santos

Bob distributed a flyer regarding "Restaurant Week in Peachtree Corners". He has been contacting new restaurants in the new Peachtree Corners area to see if we can plan a social dinner there. He has been concentrating on the Noble Fin Restaurant who features a three course meal for \$35 plus tax and tip or \$45 with tax and tip. Noble Fin is primarily seafood (some steak),

They have chopped salad, tuna tartar salad, or lobster bisque. Their entrees are black crusted New York strip, chicken meal, smoked trout, and several other fish meal choices.

Bob says that these two restaurants are possible: **Grace 1720** (two function rooms), **Noble Fin** (2 function rooms). He will report next month on possibilities. He will bring menus and then we decide on a date at next meeting. Grace 1720 is American fair. Grace is pretty much the same, but everything will depend upon how many people sign up.

There was not much interest based on these prices and it was dropped.

Bob then moved on to the Minor League Gwinnett Stripers baseball game outing like we did last year. Bob stated that the Touchdown Club Room we ate in last year is now only open to season tickets holders and we can not go there this year. Another option is to gain access to a field level booth with seats, couches, and rocking chairs on the upper level third base side. Private access and bathrooms are available. The cost would be \$49.50 per person.

A cheaper option is purchase of dugout seats in the first three rows above a dugout.. These would cost \$20 per person for the seat and \$7 for a food voucher. Total is \$27 per person. Friday May 10th is a good game against the Pawtucket Red Sox including fireworks. We would sign up people at the April meeting.

Hlad suggested an eVite would get more respondents rather than asking at a meeting. Steve Strong said he would time to do that.

Dennis Klein rose to suggest that the Assembly consider a formal dinner for the priests and deacons like we have done in the past. It would be held in one of our parish halls. Speakers would be gotten. It would be a buffet style meal.

Maybe a picnic at St. Andrew is a possibility in coming months. Chuck Langgood will check the St. Andrew calendar. He noted that there has been a lot of flooding on the parish grounds near the river. He will look into it. The retention pond is overflowed. We might need another venue.


