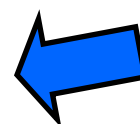

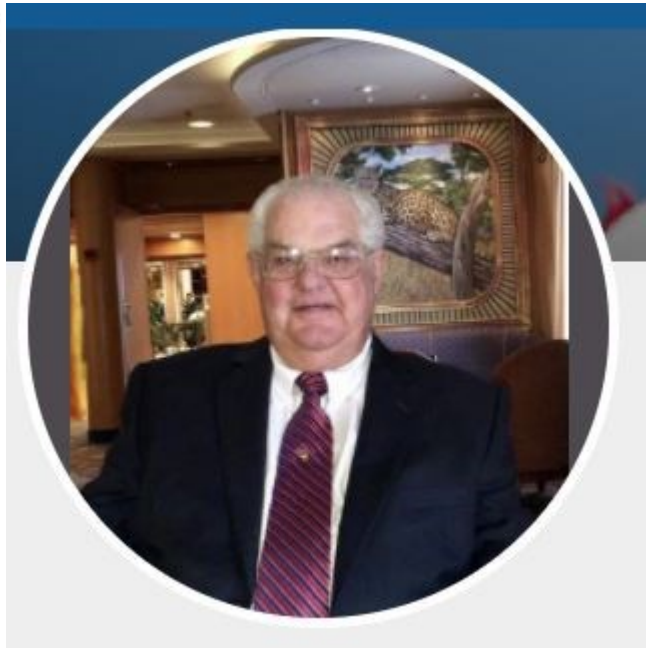

We got this very sad news that our Sir Knight Alfred Dennis Caniglia passed on Monday May 17th due to a heart attack after knee replacement surgery. We only learned of his passing from FaceBook posts. He had no local relatives. His wife, Linda, passed in 2004. They had no children. He was the president of his own insurance litigation company. He is an organ donor and will be interred in our Columbarium.

Dennis was Co-Big-Fish with Tom Simon of the All Saints annual Fish Frys and collected meal fees at the door of these events. He negotiated the food contracts with the suppliers and managed weekly deliveries. Dennis was also the chief chef at our Fish Fry Volunteer Parties with his signature whiskey steak meals. He was also the President of the All Saints Mens Club and obtained all the speakers.

Outside of his council functions, he was the President Emeritus of the Atlanta Touchdown Club and obtained celebrity speakers for those events from the world of sport. He was instrumental in choosing the winners of college scholarships, for which he often solicited partial council donations. He was very active member of the Fraternal Order of Eagles and is being celebrated by his Aerie (i.e. local chapter).

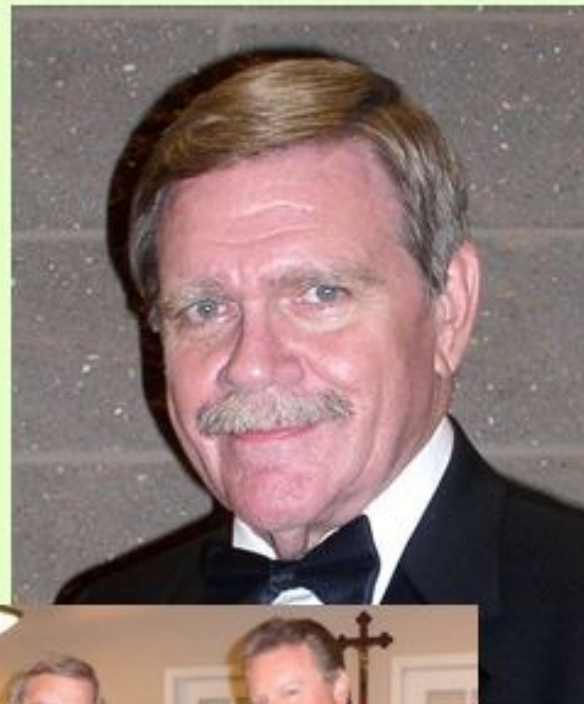

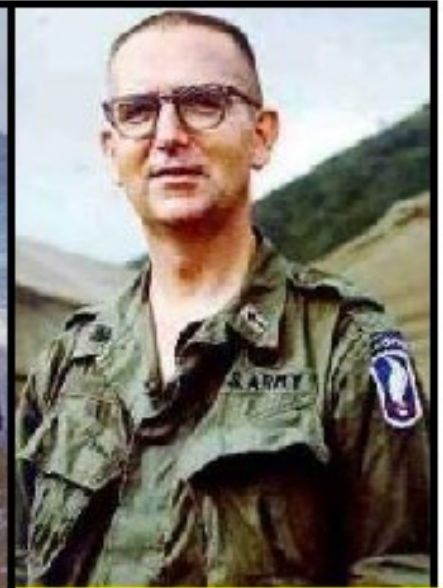

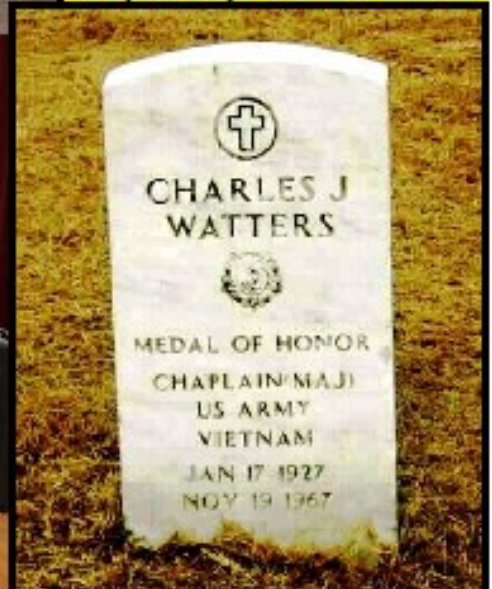
Fr. Charles J. Watters, a Knight and Vietnam chaplain, prays during a baptism – Fr. Watters later was killed in action while saving soldiers' lives
