Decorations were large icons and Cedars of Lebanon in pots that were brought in especially for the dedication.**

**Their Eastern U.S. prelate, Bishop Gregory Mansour, is a 4th degree Knight and took a group picture with us. We have 20 Maronite members currently. They need thirty to split off as their own council. Quite a memorable event.**

### Veterans reported on:

Staff Sgt. Matthew Ingham, 25, of Altoona, Pa. died Jan. 11, 2010 while supporting combat operations in Helmand province, Afghanistan. Staff Sgt. Ingham was assigned to 3rd Reconnaissance Battalion, 3rd Marine Division, III Marine Expeditionary Force, Okinawa, Japan. Upon graduation from Altoona Area High School, Matt enlisted in the Marines. He served two tours of duty in Iraq before his final tour of duty in Afghanistan. Among the medals he received are the Bronze Star Medal with Valor, Presidential Unit Citation, Good Conduct Medal, National Defense Service Medal, and NATO Medal ISAF. He was survived by his wife, Yasmin, his father, Gary, step-mother, Tammi Ingham, and a sister, Monica Ingham.

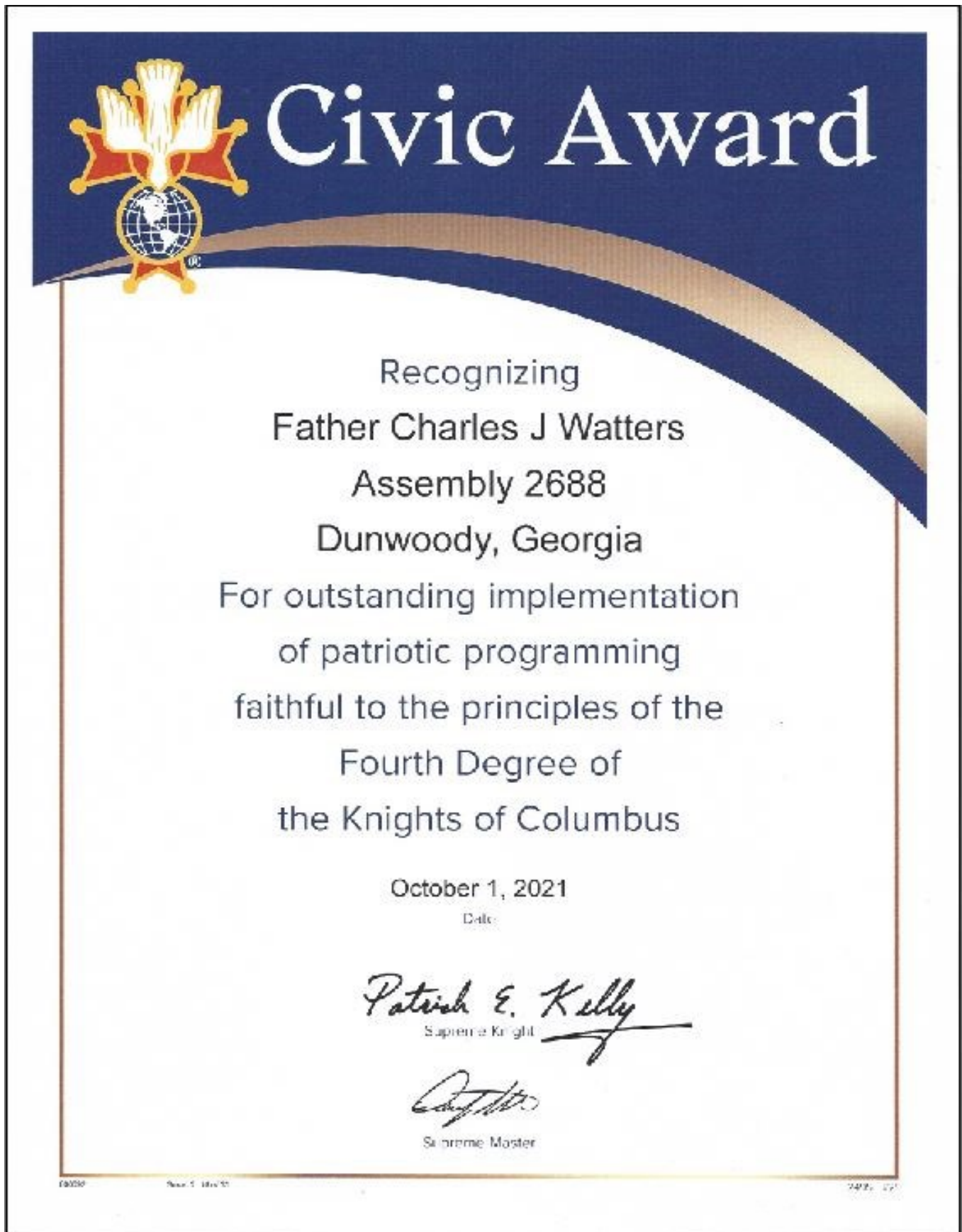

# Knights Help Consecrate Another Church

The Fr. Charles J. Watters Assembly was honored to be invited by the Eastern Rite Catholic community to participate in the official consecration ceremony for the St. Joseph Maronite Church in Sandy Springs. Their Bishop Gregory John Mansour of Brooklyn is a fourth Degree Knight and wanted knight presence there.

The Assembly is no stranger to new church consecrations, having been present at the consecration of the Chinese Holy Name of Jesus Church in Norcross and the ground-breaking and consecration of Mary Our Queen Parish in Peachtree Corners .

The nine member honoring guard consisted of Steve Strong, John Knight, Wulf Lindenau, Lou Hlad, Bernie Santa Maria, Dominic Palermo, Jon Bird, Woody Jones, and Maronite parishioner member Peter Mondalek. All nine are All Saints Council members, as were two Maronite deacons on the altar—Deacon Bob Calabrese and Subdeacon David Nasser. All Saints Council has twenty St. Joseph Parish members awaiting formation of their own new spinoff council.

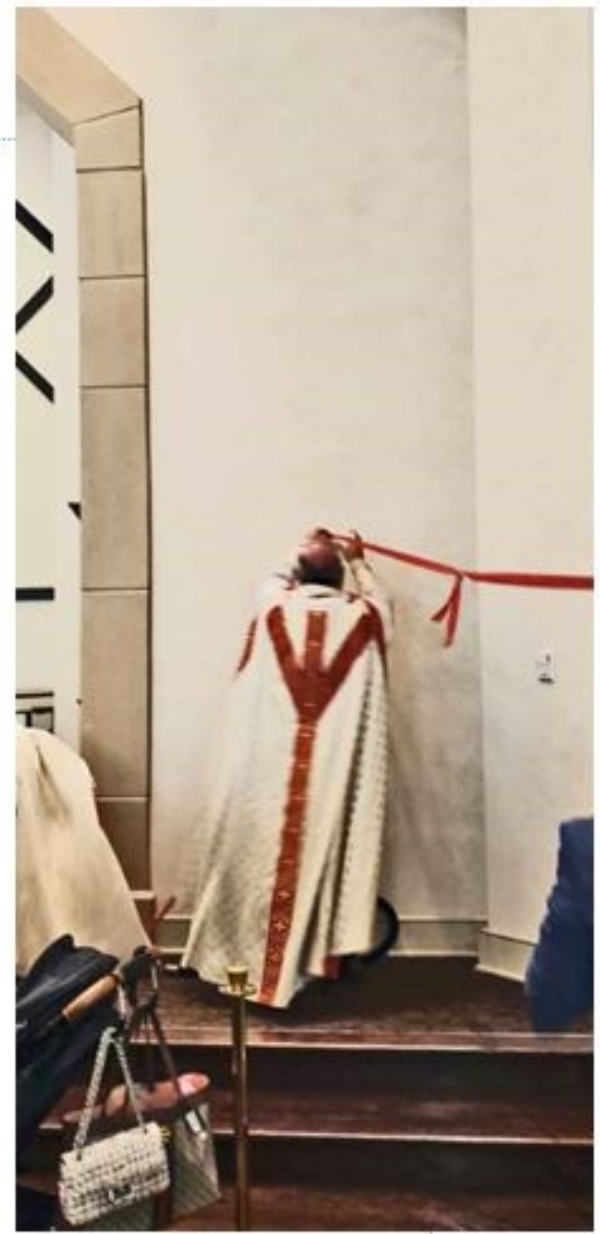
The two-hour ceremony consisted of things not seen in the Latin rite: banging on the door for entry, prayers and songs were done in Lebanese, Arabic, and Aramaic (the language of Jesus), Eucharist on the tongue soaked in wine. The church was packed with nearly 1,000 people. Walls were christened in holy oils, as was the altar. A red ribbon was mounted along the entire perimeter of the sacristy to outline the newly hallowed area. The church program was printed in three interspersed languages.

The church itself is as beautiful as any in the diocese with icons, cedars of Lebanon in pots newly arrived, beautiful stained glass, and statues. Relics of Lebanese saints were also newly arrived.
