Paying Assembly Dues Online

Fee-Free Dues Payment Now Available with Zelle

Zelle is a safe, fee-free way (with most financial institutions) to transfer money from your bank or credit union to someone you wish to pay.

Effective immediately with the 2025 Assembly dues period, you can now

- (1) write and mail/deliver a check to the Father Charles J. Watters Assembly 2688 at All Saints Church, 2443 Mt. Vernon Rd., Dunwoody GA, 30338 or
- (2) pay online via Zelle. Just like using a check, 100% of the funds are received by the recipient, and neither the sender nor the recipient are charged a fee for utilizing the service (always verify with your financial institution if they use Zelle).

Details and easy-to-follow directions can be found on your bank's website or mobile app. You will typically select "Pay & Transfer", followed by "Send Money". Assembly 2688 immediately receives 100% of the payment, and the payee rarely pays anything for this convenience.

For payment to the Assembly, our "business name" is <u>Fr. Charles J.</u> <u>Watters Assembly 2688</u> and our email address, to which payments are made, is <u>2688zelle@kc2688.org</u>.

Be sure to include your name and membership number (on your membership card), so we know who made the payment, and include a note such as "2025 Assembly Dues". Annual dues are \$30. The Faithful Comptroller and Faithful Purser receive notification of all Zelle payments.

Note that Zelle will also be available for <u>other</u> types of Assembly payments, such as sporting events (Stripers' games, etc.) and social events (dinners, entertainment, etc.) in the future.

Any amounts can be transmitted by Zelle, with proper identification of purpose. When used for these events, in addition to your name and membership number, (on your membership card), please be sure to specify what the payment is for, and include the event date, if applicable. Voluntary gifts to the Assembly may be designated "Donation".

Payment of \$30 for "2025 Assembly Dues" is now due.

Albert Mishu Obituary

Albert Butrus Mishu, of Roswell, Georgia, passed away peacefully at home on May 16, 2025, surrounded by his loving family at the age of 92. Albert was much more than an accomplished engineer; he was a man full of life, laughter, and joy. He was the life of the party, always ready with a joke, a dance, or a song to lift the spirits of those around him. His infectious humor, boundless energy, and unwavering love for his family and friends made him a cherished presence in any room. His love for his wife, Nora, and his children was unmatched, and he took immense pride in being a father, grandfather, and brother.

A man of deep faith, Albert was a lifelong student of the Bible and devoted his time to teaching church school. He was an active member of the Knights of Columbus, proudly earning the rank of 4th Degree Knight. Albert's passion for gardening, especially growing roses and calla lilies, provided him with much joy, but his true legacy lies in the memories of the laughter, warmth, and love he shared with all who knew him.


